Chicago City Worker Vaccine Mandate

Chicago, IL - Ogden & Fry, conducted an eight-question poll October 16-19, 2021, with 401 respondents. Respondents were selected by random sampling of likely voters. The margin of error for this poll is +/- 4.99% at the 95% confidence interval.

Q1: Mayor Lightfoot announced a Vaccine mandate for all City employees, effective October 15th. Under this mandate, all City of Chicago employees must submit proof of vaccination into an online portal. Employees can apply for medical or religious exemptions. Such requests will be reviewed by the Department of Human Resources on a case-by-case basis. Employees who refuse will be placed into a no-pay status. Do you support this Vaccine mandate?
